Protests and actions at the International Day Against **Racism*** throughout Germany on the **21st March 2012**.

Over 180 deaths caused by racist violence since 1990 are known in Germany. ... against populism in politics and media,

... against a policy of downplaying and concealment of the racist reality,

... for a stronger support of the victims of racist discrimination and violence,

... for a comprehensive investigation of all racist murders,

... for a discussion about institutional racisms and its dismantling,

... for an extension of human rights education as an element of anti-racist educational work

...and for an anti-racist tomorrow in solidarity.

* The International Day Against Racism on the 21st March was established in the frame of a call to increase joint efforts in the fight against racism by the UN General Assembly in 1966. This day was established to remember the 21st March 1960. On that day 69 Black protesters were shot by the police in Sharpville (South Africa), when they demonstrated against the racist apartheid laws.
